Proposed Annual School Lands Trust Meeting Schedule:

SLT Meeting Rules of Order and Procedures:

The meetings will usually be part of the Governing Board meeting and be part of that meeting's agenda and follow the protocol of those meetings. If a

separate SLT meeting is noticed and held, it will likewise follow the format of a Rockwell Governing Board meeting.

Summary Report for 2017-18:

The Rockwell School Lands Trust Committee, as seated in 2017-18, determined to support a decision made in 2015 by the then-seated Rockwell Governing Board, which also acted as the School Lands Trust Committee at that time, that any and all School Lands Trust funding would be utilized to maintain and keep updated the school's technology effort. It has been unanimously approved each year since then. This would also explain the lack of meetings as this happens in a single meeting and is then carried out by the school's personnel responsible for such efforts.

In 2017-18, \$39,362 were awarded to the school from the School Lands Trust fund, which comes from open land essentially rented to a variety of interests throughout Utah. These funds were all directed to hardware, software, materials to wire and connect such things, as well as general upkeep. Rockwell is grateful that these funds are made available to the school as they allow two computer labs as well as classroom access and tools to exist that give students in every subject opportunities to grow and learn.
